Organizations (MCOs) Pharmacy Educational Diagnosis Code at

Point of Sale (POS) for Oral Contraceptives Update

On October 1, 2018, the Louisiana Medicaid Fee for Service Pharmacy Program in collaboration with the Louisiana Medicaid Drug Utilization Review (LADUR) Board implemented an <u>educational alert</u> encouraging the use of a diagnosis code at Point of Sale (POS) for oral contraceptives. The diagnosis code is needed for pharmacy reporting to identify oral contraceptive prescription claims when used as a family planning benefit.

The following specifications apply to the educational alert for oral contraceptives.

- Prescribers are encouraged to write an ICD-10-CM Diagnosis Code on the original prescription.
- If an ICD-10-CM Diagnosis Code is not written on the original prescription, the NCPDP field 424-DO (Diagnosis Code) may be left blank.
- This is an educational alert and does not interfere with pharmacy claims payment.

The acceptable diagnosis codes for oral contraceptives listed are either as a family planning benefit or for menstrual disorders.

ICD-10-CM Diagnosis Code	Diagnosis Description	
Z30*	Encounter for oral contraceptive management	
F32.81	Premenstrual dysphoric disorder	
N92*	Excessive, frequent and irregular menstruation	

^{*}any number or letter or combination of UP TO FOUR numbers and letters of an assigned ICD-10-CM diagnosis code.

Medicaid FFS and MCOs Diagnosis Code Requirements for Oral Contraceptives October 4, 2018 Page 2

The National Council for Prescription Drug Programs (NCPDP) codes listed below will apply to both FFS and MCO pharmacy claims. The EOB codes will apply to FFS pharmacy claims only.

Pharmacy claims for oral contraceptives submitted without an acceptable diagnosis code or missing diagnosis code will flag the claim with an educational alert suggesting the use of a diagnosis code.

NCPDP code 39 (Missing or Invalid Diagnosis Code) mapped to:

FFS Only →EOB code 575 (Missing or Invalid Diagnosis Code).

This is an educational alert. The pharmacist can document the diagnosis code on the hardcopy prescription or in the pharmacy's electronic recordkeeping system if communicated by the prescriber or prescriber's agent.

Override provisions are not necessary for an educational alert. The pharmacy claim will process for payment if the NCPDP field 424-DO (Diagnosis Code) is left blank.
